

Travel:

The Freeman Hospital is easily located just north east of Newcastle city centre. A map is attached separately in the PDF document.

By Road:

From the south: follow signs from the A1 for the A184 (City centre). At the first junction take the third exit sign posted the Quayside. Turn left onto the Tyne bridge at the second main intersection. Continue on the central motorway and take the exit for Gosforth. At the roundabout take the third exit and continue through a set of traffic lights. At the next roundabout take the third exit and at the next immediate roundabout take the third exit where the road goes uphill. The Freeman hospital is a short distance on the left hand side. Parking is available at the front of the hospital.

From the north: Exit the A1 onto the B1318 (great north road – signposted to Gosforth). Continue on the road through a number of traffic lights and over 2 roundabouts. At the intersection just before the main Gosforth high street turn left on the A191. At the roundabout go straight over and then take the third exit at the immediate next roundabout. The Freeman hospital is on the left hand side.

By Rail:

From the main station in Newcastle you can get the metro to South Gosforth metro station and the Freeman hospital is a 10 minute walk from the metro station. Alternatively it is a 10 minute taxi ride with taxi's always available outside the station.

By Bus:

The Number 38 runs regularly from the City Centre.

By Air:

There is a metro station at Newcastle International Airport and a metro can take you to South Gosforth station, the closest to the Freeman Hospital. A Taxi takes 15-20 mins.


Dietary Requirements
